
When it Rains it Pours

Hazardous waste collection Saturday, July 23

The county's Hazardous Waste Collection program provides an opportunity for residents to safely dispose of household hazardous waste. The location closest to the Borough is the Middle Bucks Institute of Technology, 2740 Old York Road (Rt.263) in Warwick Township. This year it will be held on Saturday, July 23, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Common household items being collected include caustics such as oven cleaner and ammonia-based cleaners; batteries including rechargeable and button type as well as automotive; pesticides; toxics such as weed killer, pool and photographic chemicals, rust remover and wood preservatives; flammables such as oil-based paints, varnishes, gasoline. DO NOT BRING latex paint, appliances, asbestos, explosives or tires. For details, call 215-345-3400.

Beginning this year, the US Census Bureau will conduct a rolling sample of households nationwide. The data collected will be similar to the census data previously collected every 10 years. This will enable our communities to have an annual "snapshot" of community characteristics to help access local needs such as new roads, schools or senior centers, and ensure that communities receive their fair share of government and business funding.


The American Community Survey will be sent to about 2.5 percent of the population each year. When your's arrives, please complete and return it as soon as possible.

Underage Alcohol Bicycle Patrols and Tobacco Compliance Grants


For the second year, we have received grant funding for the Underage Alcohol Bicycle Patrols and Tobacco Compliance Enforcement from the Bucks County Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence (BCCADD). The Underage Alcohol Bicycle Patrols enable officers to patrol out-of-the-way places where juveniles may gather to drink.

Tobacco Compliance checks are done monthly for a period of 6 months per year. A trained teenager, working in conjunction with a volunteer adult and a Police Officer, attempts to purchase cigarettes at local establishments that sell tobacco products.

Both of these programs have proven to be very effective here in the Borough. We are grateful to Jim Wall and the BCCADD for their help and dedication in keeping our youth safe.
