

1998 Budget

The 1998 budget approved by Borough Council totals \$848,210. Total anticipated revenue in 1998 is \$612,208. In addition, there is a Road Construction Fund of \$180,000 and a cash surplus of \$56,002. While the 1998 budget represents an increase of about \$50,000 over 1997, the Borough tax rate remains unchanged.




In addition, a 3-mill Fire Protection Tax provides funds for the two fire companies that serve the Borough, Doylestown and Chalfont.



New Britain Borough is once again sponsoring its Summer Recreation Program at Covered Bridge Community Park. The camp for children ages six (or beginning 1st grade in September) through 12 will operate daily Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. from June 22 to July 31, 1998.

A Reminder to Pet Owners

In order to insure the peace and general welfare of Borough residents, Ordinance No. 93-258 states that it is illegal to possess a domestic animal or bird which makes any noise continuously and/or incessantly for a period of ten minutes, or makes such noise intermittently for one-half hour or more to the disturbance of any person at any time of the day or night. Please be sure that your pet does not unnecessarily disturb your neighbors. A fine may be imposed for such an offence.

Grass & Weeds

Property owners are required to keep grass and weeds to a height not to exceed 8 inches. The purpose is not only to keep the community neat and attractive, but to protect residents from possible health risks associated with overgrowth.

Announced

Repairs are planned for some Borough roads throughout the spring/summer months. Cherokee Road between Lenape Drive and Pueblo Drive will be reconstructed. South Shady Retreat Road will be completely rebuilt between Route 202 and the SEPTA railroad tracks. Also planned is surface sealing on Keeley Avenue, Lenape Road, Pavillion Way, Carousel Circle, Britain Drive, Maple Lane and Maple Court.

Historical Tidbit

New Britain Borough was carved out of the Township and incorporated in 1928. Within the Borough limits along Route 202, the New Britain Baptist Church, founded in 1740 by the first settler families in the area, is still, more than 250 years later, caring for a loyal congregation. The graveyard is the resting place for many early patriots who served or gave their lives in wars from the American Revolution through World War II.
