


The Delaware Canal In Art

Disposing of Leaves

Waste haulers licensed in the Borough must pick up leaf/garden waste at least once a month. BFI collects yard wastes, which can include leaves, each Monday. Waste Management will collect leaves on regular pick-up days (their maximum of 5 containers, bags and cans, applies). Leaves can be placed in the regular yard waste containers or biodegradable paper bags — NO PLASTIC BAGS PLEASE. Contact your hauler for more specific instructions.

Some environmentally sound ways to dispose of leaves are:

- √Compost the leaves to create a valuable soil additive
- ✓Spread leaves in wooded areas of your property.
- ✓ Shred leaves on your lawn by running over them with your mower, leaving remnants to break down into useful mulch which will benefit your grass.
- ✓ Leaves are "recycled" and used by William Hirst of Highland Hill Farm. Residents can drop off leaves at the farm located at 520 Dublin Pike or call for pick up at 345-0946.

If you plan to burn leaves, the Borough Ordinance sets forth the following rules:

- √Public roads cannot be used for burning leaves.
- Leaves should not be burned when atmospheric conditions make fires hazardous. Choose a cool day with low atmospheric pressure (the smoke will dissipate more rapidly). Burn when the wind is calm.
- ✓Fires must be continuously monitored until extinguished. Extinguishing equipment (hose, buckets of water, etc.) should be available.
- ✓No fires are permitted after sunset.

Permits Required for Roofs and Siding

New Britain Borough residents who want to install new roofs or siding must have a zoning and building permit before work begins. In addition, the roofer and siding contractor should submit a certificate of insurance.

Youth Center News

The Chalfont Community Teen Center celebrated its first anniversary on September 12,1999. About 350 teens from the community attended at least once last year.

This year, a new format has been adopted that should appeal to older teens and, at the same time, keep the interest of the younger teens. The format is as follows:

Friday: The Center will be open to teens in 9th through 12th grades. During the hours of 4:00 to 10:00 p.m., teens may watch movies, listen to music, play pool and ping pong, participate in discussion groups, plan events, socialize, etc.

Saturday; The Center will be open to teens in 7th and 8th grades (also from 4:00 to 10:00 p.m.) who may participate in organized recreational activities, a variety of games, contests, tournaments, dances, arts and crafts, or just hanging out with friends. Some activities set up for October are; an ice cream sundae

night, pictionary, pumpkin carving, pet day, dried flower arranging, bingo with prizes, foul shooting contest, Halloween dance and much more.



Upcoming Road Repairs Announced

A number of road improvement projects are scheduled for completion in 1999. Your patience and cooperation will be greatly appreciated.

- New water mains and street reconstruction will take place on Pawnee Road, from Lenape to North Tamanend.
- Micro-surfacing will be applied to the following streets: Carousel Circle, Pavilion Way, Lenape Drive, Stephan Place, Green Valley Drive, Evergreen Drive, Barrie Circle and Heritage Lane.
- Surface treatment (oil and chips) will be applied to: Maple Lane, Maple Court, Keeley Avenue, Landis Mill Road, Britain Drive, Hawk Circle, Lampost Road, Buelah Road, Cedar Land (partially) and Sand Road.
- Drainage improvements will be performed on Hawk Circle (new inlet) and Cedar Drive (new inlet and cross drain)


