
Light refreshments will be provided on both evenings.

On a slightly different matter, we are planning to place several benches in the nature preserve. You may have seen the heavy duty memorial benches in Doylestown, with a brass plate dedicating it to significant events or loved ones. They are bolted to poured concrete pads to raise them above the ground and ensure stability.

School's Open: Pine Run Elementary School is monitored by police during the opening and closing of school each day. Please be cautious and adhere to the 15mph speed limit in order to keep our children safe.

Halloween Safety – Halloween is a lot of fun for the entire family; however, some precautions should be taken to ensure a happy and safe day of festivities.

- Teach children to stop only at well-lit houses and to never enter a stranger's home.
- Instruct children not to eat any treat until they return home and treats are inspected.
- Provide a flashlight to help children see better and be seen more clearly.
- Only fire-retardant materials in costumes should be used.
- Costumes and treat bags should have some reflective qualities to be seen by motorists.
- Costume length should not be so long that it is a tripping hazard.
- Accessories such as swords or knives should be made from cardboard or flexible materials and made so as not to resemble a real weapon.

Distance to walk: 1/2 mile

Police officers will be actively patrolling the walk routes and assisting with street crossings. Residents and businesses located along the routes have been notified of the event, and many will have "Walk to School" signs posted in their yards.

Council and staff of New Britain Borough invites all residents and local business owners to our annual Holiday Open House. Share the holiday spirit with your neighbors and meet informally with Borough officials. Snacks and beverages will be provided.

Leaf Burning Regulations

If you plan to burn leaves, the Borough Ordinance sets forth the following rules;

- Public roads cannot be used for burning leaves.
- Leaves should not be burned when atmospheric conditions make fires hazardous. Choose a cool day with low atmospheric pressure (the smoke will dissipate more rapidly). Burn leaves when the wind is calm.
- Fires must be continuously monitored until extinguished. Extinguishing equipment (hose, buckets of water, etc.) is required.
- ✓ No fires are permitted after sunset.

IMPORTANT NOTE: You are not permitted to blow or rake leaves or grass clippings into the street. That practice can clog stormdrains.

This Winter...please remember:

- * Clear sidewalks of ice and snow within 24 hours of a snowfall.
- * Make sure the **fire hydrant** near your property is cleared of snow and ice.
- * All vehicles must be off the street within one hour of beginning of snowfall and until the roads have been cleared.
- * Make sure your mail box is at least 6" behind the curb or edge of pavement to allow for plowing.

Protect our Water Quality

It's fall already and a time to keep in mind our streams and water quality.

Please dispose of leaves, grass clippings, and yard waste properly (outside of flood and waterways where they can be washed downstream causing pollution and possibly blocking pipes, inlets and restrictions in streams). If you notice an inlet clogged, either call the Borough or clear the grate and dispose of the debris properly.

Pool owners are required to discharge water responsibly as per Borough and PADEP rules and regulations. The Clean Stream Law prohibits the discharge of chemically contaminated water into streams or storm sewers. Contaminated pool water quickly makes its way to streams where aquatic life is damaged or killed.

You can protect our streams. Stormwater picks up debris and pollutants as it travels toward streams. Limiting use of herbicides and fertilizers, and disposing of hazardous materials properly to hazardous waste drop offs, protects our streams. Store any hazardous materials (paint, oil, anti-freeze, etc.) in safe places, and dispose of old materials properly. Additional stormwater information is available at:


Needed: Old photos of New Britain
